From the Pastor's Desk

We are quickly heading toward Thanksgiving. Coming as the holiday does toward the end of a year which has been so challenging for a great many people, perhaps we would do especially well to deliberately pause and offer thanks to God.

Poking around on the internet yields a treasure trove of observations on gratitude and thanksgiving from a wide assortment of characters.

Doris Day: "Gratitude is riches. Complaint is poverty."

John Milton: "Gratitude bestows reverence, allowing us to encounter everyday epiphanies, those transcendent moments of awe that change forever how we experience life and the world."

Henry David Thoreau: "I am grateful for what I am and have. My thanksgiving is perpetual."

John Clayton: "Thanksgiving is a time when the world gets to see just how blessed and how workable the Christian system is. The emphasis is not on giving or buying, but on being thankful and expressing that appreciation to God and to one another."

The Bible calls us over and again to cultivate gratitude and to offer thanksgiving to God. Psalm 100 declares:

"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise! Give thanks to him; bless his name! For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations."

We give thanks not because life is always easy, or free of trial and tribulation, but because behind it all, God is good, and we live our lives in the context of a benevolent and loving Providence.

In the midst of the Civil War, President Lincoln issued a Thanksgiving Proclamation. An excerpt of which reads:

"I do, therefore, invite my fellow-citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next as a Day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the heavens."

May this year's holiday allow you opportunity to explore the blessings in your life and offer thanks to the One from whom all good comes.

**Did you know** this church is the only Glendale church partnering with the Glendale Police Department to provide Thanksgiving Boxes to our neighbors in need?

Thanks to your generosity, 25 Glendale families receive a box of food and a Kroger gift card so they can enjoy a traditional Thanksgiving meal.

We met with Chief Warman this summer to gain a better understanding of the family size the box is designed to feed. He told us we should aim for a family of 5 and assured us that families larger than 5 members will receive additional boxes so there will be enough food for everyone in the household.

We revised the foods list this year, adding quantity and size (ounces or pounds) for each item, hoping the revised list will make your shopping less stressful and provide peace of mind that you are meeting the needs of your neighbors who need a little extra help during the holidays. In addition to the food you provide, The Mission committee will provide

> a Kroger gift card for each box and the church will provide a holiday greeting.

You will find a couple other requests from Chief Warman

included on the foods list in each box, so please read it carefully.

Thanksgiving boxes will be available in the Church House Sundays, November 1 and 8, and should be returned to the Church House no later than Sunday, November 16.

O Lord, comfort their heartswe know that you are able,


And let them know that this year, there's another chair at Heaven's Table!
